

At Brotherton and Byram CP Academy, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of all our children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver quality in-house PE sessions.

We expect to receive £8,550 for the year 2016-17. This is to benefit every child in our school. We currently have 157 children on roll from age 4 to age 11 years.

#### How is it spent:

In partnership with Selby High School and Brayton High school and the other primary schools within the Selby area, the Sports premium pays for the services of a Schools Sports Co-ordinator. We also employ the specialist Sports coach Steven Jeff, who has made an immediate impact in the quality of coaching delivered and CPD opportunities for teachers to work alongside him as well AT's.

#### Element 1:

Element 1: looks at increasing the opportunities available for our pupils through the use of extra-curricular activities and competitions as well as children experiencing sports that would not be accessible to many of our pupils. This has raised the profile of PE across the school which has included developing sports leaders and gaining the Gold School Games award. After feedback from teachers, parents and pupil voice we have provided more opportunities in the form of different sports clubs such as gymnastics and dance. Football, multi-skills and netball clubs have been offered throughout the year and have been extremely successful, with a high number of children participating from year 1-6. The money provided has enabled our school to get all Y4 children learning to ski at Xscape in Castleford as well. The intake for these clubs has increased significantly, therefore resulting in more active children enjoying their sporting experiences at Brotherton and Byram. The success of this has been measured by:

- the children competing in a range of different intra-school and inter-school competitions in sports such as Quicksticks Hockey, sportshall athletics, Cross-Country, Swimming, Quadkids athletics and even a dodgeball competition!
- Winning the Gold School Games award to show our commitment to sport in school.
- All Year 4 children achieving a recreational skiers award scheme.
- The school for the past 6 years representing the Selby District at the school games level 3 competition in sports such as Netball, hockey, football, Tag Rugby and Girls football

Children are now developing a competitive attitude towards sport and developing key life skills in relation to success and motivation enabling them to strive to be the best they can in any situation.

In addition, a greater number of pupils who do not normally choose to access sporting activities are doing so in a non-competitive atmosphere.

#### Element 2:

Element 2 looks at upskilling our staff in their delivery of PE and meeting the required standards of the national curriculum. All teachers and ATs are receiving specialist training and mentoring through a specialist sports coach within our school. Our subject leader in sport has had the opportunity to attend specific management courses as well as regular termly meetings with the Selby cluster sports coordinator which are then communicated back to the sports coach, teachers and ATs. As well as this, staff have the opportunity to attend coaching courses in Tag rugby, Netball and hockey. The success has been measured by the sports coach coaching other staff members including the development of teacher and AT subject knowledge and improved confidence in delivering a range of sports across the curriculum. The sports coach has also attained a gymnastics qualification as well as an ASA swimming qualification.
